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Abstract

The abstract text is written with a font size of 10 pt, and the times new roman typeface and the spacing between lines are one space. Article abstract should be written in English. The abstract explains the problem and purpose of the research briefly but clearly shows the main variables or concepts that are in focus. The next section briefly describes the research method or design, which includes an explanation of who the research subjects are, the number of samples as well as the main findings of the study. It ends with a conclusion. The abstract should be able to give its readers a general but complete overview of the article. The abstract is written in one paragraph with a number of words less than 250 words.

1. Introduction

The introduction should be succinct, with no subheadings. Limited figures may be included only if they are truly introductory, and contain no new results.

2. Materials and Methods

The materials and methods section should be described with sufficient detail to allow others to replicate and build on published results. New methods and protocols should be described in detail while well-established methods can be briefly described and appropriately cited. Give the name and version of any software used. It may be divided into headed subsections if several methods are described.

3. Results and Discussion

This section may be divided by subheadings. It should provide a concise and precise description of the experimental results, their interpretation as well as the experimental conclusions that can be drawn.

3.2. Advice on Equations

Equations should be provided in a text format, rather than as an image. Microsoft Word's equation tool is acceptable. Equations should be numbered consecutively, in round brackets, on the right-hand side of the page. They should be referred to as Equation 1, etc. in the main text.

Advice on Figures

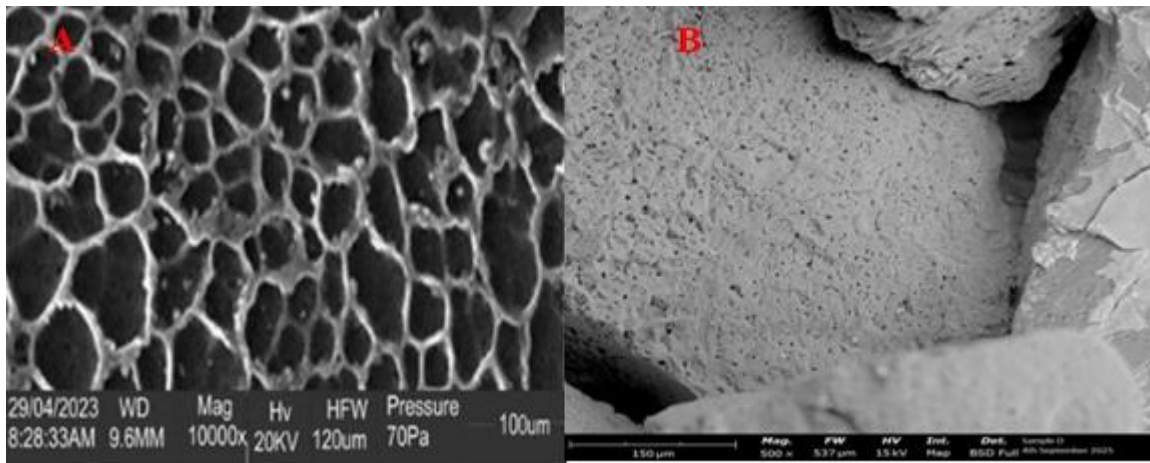


Figure 1: xxx

At the point of submission, authors may provide all figures embedded within the manuscript at a convenient break near where they are first referenced. All figures should be cited in the paper in consecutive order. Where possible, figures should be displayed on a white background. All figures must have an accompanying caption, which includes a title and, preferably, a brief description (**see Figure 1**).

Advice on Tables

Every table must have a descriptive title and, if numerical measurements are given, the units should be included in the column heading. Vertical rules should not be used (see **Table 1**). Tables should be cited consecutively in the text.

4. Conclusions

This section is mandatory. A conclusion may review the main points of the paper, do not replicate the abstract as the conclusion. A conclusion might elaborate on the importance of the work or suggest applications and extensions.
